## Friends of Yemin Orde's E-Newsletter Wins Simon Rockower Award for Excellence in Jewish Journalism

**FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE – Bethesda, MD.** Friends of Yemin Orde has received a first place Simon Rockower Award for Excellence in Jewish Journalism from the American Jewish Press Association (AJPA) for its digital newsletter, which is distributed primarily throughout the United States and Israel. The prestigious annual award, started in 1980 to promote quality Jewish journalism, is often referred to as the “Jewish Pulitzers.” Friends of Yemin Orde’s enewsletter is called “*Transforming Lives. Empowering Change.*” and carries feature articles and news from Yemin Orde Youth Village and Yemin Orde Educational Initiatives (YOEI), both located in Israel. This is the first time Friends of Yemin Orde has received recognition for its digital communications. Friends of Yemin Orde is the U.S. fundraising arm of Yemin Orde Youth Village and YOEI. The award will be officially presented at the Rockower Awards Banquet in Washington, D.C. in November 2015.

Today, YOEI partners with 24 educational communities in Israel including youth villages, public high schools and therapeutic residential communities. Since 2006, YOEI has impacted 4,800 youth and 900 educators in Israel.*
